While the realization of justice can be comforting, it is not usually comfortable... or predictable.

Dear friends,

There was a famous letter written in Birmingham, Alabama, in April 1963. It was a religious appeal for common sense, peaceful dialogue, and constructive solutions to the challenge of racial unrest. I am speaking, of course, about the "Statement by Alabama Clergymen," a letter penned by eight white clerics of different denominations (including an Episcopal bishop!). This eminently hopeful and reasonable appeal had one primary contention — that peaceful protests by black citizens were wrong. They agreed that change was necessary, but these men of God were adamant that there were proper channels for racial debate. "We do not believe that these days of new hope are the days when extreme measures are justified in Birmingham," the clergymen wrote. In his Birmingham jail cell, a young Martin Luther King Jr. picked up his pen in response.

In today's world, we often assure ourselves that doing right will look right, and *feel* right. Listening to today's selection from the Gospel of John we think, 'Of course the disciples would want to follow Jesus! Of course Dr. King was right to take to the streets for equal rights!' Yet in the midst of those moments and movements, success was not somehow inevitable. Jesus promised Nathanael would "see greater things than these," but he didn't promise when. While the realization of justice can be comforting, it is not usually comfortable...or predictable.

In his letter of response, Dr. King challenged his fellow clergy, reminding them that we are all co-workers with God, who "must use time creatively, in the knowledge that the time is always ripe to do right." One of the gifts of our church community is that we can attempt this hard work together.

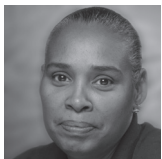

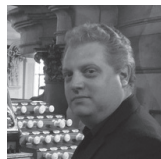
