Dear friends,

For four days in mid-February, 11 members of the St. James' Youth group, along with five chaperones, visited St. Vincent's School for Handicapped Children in Port-au-Prince, Haiti. We had long days of laughing, playing, and talking with our friends there, and working and worshipping together. This was a powerful experience that several of our youth will preach on today. I can't say just what this trip meant for them—I'll let them do that!—but I will say that for all of us, this was a step forward on our personal journeys of Christian discipleship.

Perhaps I'm not the only one who finds the word discipleship a bit intimidating, even as I long to walk more closely with God, and follow Jesus' call more faithfully. We can forget that the disciples were pretty much a constant work in progress, growing and learning and stopping and stalling along the way just like we do. Today's Gospel from John includes a nice reminder of this very fact: "After he was raised from the dead, his disciples remembered that he had said this; and they believed the scripture and the word that Jesus had spoken" (emphasis mine). Even Jesus' best friends took a little while to realize just what he was up to—but luckily for them, with God there's no such thing as "too late".

The trip may be over, but I don't think any of us pilgrims are done turning the experience over in our minds, or have stopped being surprised by new thoughts and insights. Even if God's love is always active in the world around us, the path that love is calling us to journey may take time to unfurl ahead of us, and certainly involves more turns and belated realizations than we might have planned on. But the path of discipleship is there, uniquely ours under our feet, whenever we are ready to walk it.
