### Dear friends,

A few times each year, I am asked to preside over a service for the renewal of marriage vows. Most often it's around a significant anniversary—10, 15, or 20 years and so on. Sometimes though it is just because the couple feel like they have come through or are in a particularly significant time in their family story. Those reasons can be as diverse as the recent birth of a grandchild, a serious illness that the couple is facing into, a change in career, or a difficult passage in the marriage. Yet despite those variations, the form of this very brief service is always the same, because the promises a couple make at their wedding and reaffirm in this service are vows that can sustain them through all that can (and often does) occur.

Several times a year, including today at confirmation, we reaffirm our baptismal promises. They don't change either, but just like those married couples, we baptized and confirmed Christians can find ourselves in seasons of life when remembering those first promises (which are really first principles of the faith), can be particularly important. Reassuring perhaps, as we recall that at our baptism we were marked as Christ's own forever. No exceptions. Sobering perhaps, as we admit how hard it is to persevere against evil or repent and return to the Lord. Challenging perhaps, when we realize that seeking and serving Christ in all persons sometimes demands more than we wish to give or do. Although the promises don't change, they can change everything for us. May it be so.

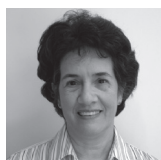

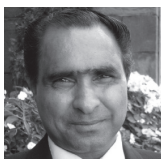

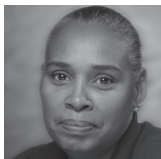
