### Dear friends,

Welcome to the season of Advent. Traditionally, Advent has been a time of preparation and penitence — not too unlike Lent! — as we ready ourselves to celebrate the birth of Christ, the incarnation of God in the world. The beginning of Advent also marks a new year in our church calendar, a shifting in the scriptures we read and the prayers we say. For that reason, many Christians find Advent a ripe time to adopt a new spiritual practice.

When I was younger, I was always intrigued by the idea that church had its own New Year, which would come at the beginning of December rather than the end. As an adult, however, I find the prospect of New Year's slightly less exciting. It usually means trying and failing some new resolution, and feeling the pressure to do everything better, or at least better than the last time. Another New Year, on top of the stress of holiday planning? Oh, brother.

But this is the funny thing about church. Despite being the source of so much of our culture (Christmas, anyone?), our beliefs stand in opposition to it. To live a Christian life on Madison Avenue in December is actually deeply counter-cultural. When every other message you get is rush rush and buy buy buy, our practice is to slow down and reflect on what we already have. In the stillness of prayer or the revelry of caroling, we can pause to listen for what God has to say to us, and even simply to enjoy the world of love and light God has made for us. After a year of striving to see God at work in the world around us, we get the chance to slow down and celebrate that incredible gift. To mark the season of Advent is to rededicate ourselves to the practice of joy.

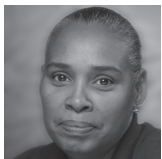

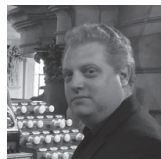
